maybe more.

I first worked as a library technician
at the City of Mississauga.

And then while working there,
I was able to do

part time studies at Erindale,
which was then called Erindale,

which is UTM and got my degree.

My bachelor's degree, my B.A. of arts,

and then I was able to take time off
from work to go to Western

to the School of Library Information
Science, as it was then called.

So I was born and brought up there,

is probably one of the most common ones.

in Jamaica.

and they had,

new installation,
relatively new installation in Jamaica.

And he was sent down there to work there,
along with the Jamaican staff.

I guess he would say he was there
for the year.

We met, got engaged, got married

and went over to Trinidad,
where we were for two and a half years.

So it's quite interesting
and a lot different

from Jamaica than you expect.

We came in 1960 and

which was a bit of a culture shock for me,
actually, it's a lot colder there.

I mean, it was the first time
I'd been in Canada.

Okay.

We were there for four and a half years,
and then my husband

another posting in Jamaica for 18 months.

So we went back to Jamaica, which was nice

because I then could see my family
and everything and

came back to Canada in 1966.

And the reason we settled in Burlington
was, quite frankly,

You know, Canada doesn't mind us too much.

I could actually show you
my old passport.

I brought my old and my latest one

so you can see the difference.

I had to,

Well first of all, I had to get married
and apply for a passport, Jamaican.

you know, in those days,
it was a British passport.

Because in 19--like when we left in 1960,

Jamaica was still a colony.

I know they have their own Jamaican
passports.

certainly not even for a British subject.

So it came as a surprise.

We are a mixed group,

There's a lot of intermarriage and
other mixtures.

So, yeah.

But, you know.

I don't think it matters
that much anymore.

I mean, people recognize me

You know in the winter, when it is dark

and the days are short,

It's cold...

I kind of wish...

I kind of miss it then

Oh, it's hard to say.

One of the things

I had a lot of friends in Jamaica

that I went to school with and

most of them are gone now.

That's something I miss as well,
you know.

Or they're all scattered.

00:08:19:15 - 00:08:21:28

I only got one remaining

00:08:21:28 - 00:08:26:02

relative and she's a distant cousin
still living in Jamaica.

Haven't seen her for quite a while.

00:08:30:07 - 00:08:33:07

So that's part of it I guess.

You settle in, you have to adapt.

But there was another thing,

Jamaica's changed a lot.

You know, there's that old saying,
no, you can't go home again.

If you go back,

your home is not your home anymore.

I'll give you an example.

I was meeting his brother and
his brother's wife for the first time.

Really there wasn't any...

in Toronto that my parents knew.

So they weren't my generation.

But knowing that we had to say
we were pretty well on our own.

when came here to Burlington.

But Burlington was smaller then.

It wasn't like now.

And people were very friendly.

We all

because a number of us purchased homes
at the same time in that neighborhood.

Back on Pinedale.

We were over there on Joel Avenue.

We got to know each other

and we were friends.

00:10:18:11 - 00:10:21:17

We have street parties,
that sort of thing.

Oh, it wasn't that bad.

00:10:26:05 - 00:10:28:03

I mean

00:10:28:03 - 00:10:30:04

you have to adapt and sort of settle in,

00:10:30:04 - 00:10:33:11

you know, especially when you got
kids, you don't have time to

00:10:34:13 - 00:10:35:14

feel sorry for yourself.

00:10:35:14 - 00:10:39:19

You got to get sorted out
and get them to school and everything,

00:10:39:27 - 00:10:40:23

you know.

00:10:40:23 - 00:10:43:23

And then eventually my marriage ended.

In 84.

I moved away for a while, he moved too.

So I actually came back to Burlington
a second time.

2000.

So I've been here steady ever since.

Living in Burlington Towers, actually,

which was the other end of town.

And so I got to know a whole new area

and really, really like it.

Love it actually.

I'm a member of St. Luke's Church.

Made a lot of close friends there as well.

Plus, I'm also involved in genealogy

cemeteries, family cemeteries,

that are falling into disrepair.

I'm very happy to see that the Burlington
Historical Society has been working

to restore the Union Burial Ground,
which was, you know, where it is, right?

By Ikea.

There's a lot of work
that needs to be done there as well.

But I mean, I would
have loved to take part in it,
